GRADING SYSTEM AND CLASS RANK

Letter grades are assigned a numerical value: A = 4, B = 3, C = 2, D = 1 and F = 0. College recommending grades are A, B and C. The grade of D is a passing grade. The Total GPA includes all classes and the Academic GPA excludes non-college-prep courses. Courses designated with a (p) notation are college prep and meet the University of California “a-g” subject requirements. The Acalanes Union High School District does not numerically rank students.

COVID-19 Impact: Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, AUHSD transitioned to distance learning for the 4th Quarter of the 2019-2020 school year. As a result of this instructional change, all AUHSD schools adopted a Credit/No Mark grading system for the Spring Semester of the 2019-2020 school year. In accordance with CA State Assembly Bill 104, parents/guardians had the right to direct the school to change any 2020-2021 semester grade to either Pass or No Pass. Marks of Credit / No Credit and Pass / No Pass are not reflected in a student’s GPA.
