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SCHOOL & COMMUNITY CHARACTERISTICS

Acalanes High School is located in Lafayette, California, a suburban community east of the Berkeley hills and approximately 25 miles from San Francisco. The Lafayette community values high-quality education and has a long history of strong community support offering financial resources through the Parents Club, Education Foundation and Booster Groups to enrich our school's academic and co-curricular programs.

Acalanes High School is one of four comprehensive high schools in the Acalanes Union High School District (AUHSD), which is known for its strong tradition of academic excellence and outstanding student performance. Acalanes enrolls approximately 1,250 students grades 9 through 12. Our students are motivated and well prepared with over 90% of seniors attending post-secondary institutions after graduation. Acalanes ranks in the top tier of all California high schools, is fully accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC), and recognized as a California Distinguished School.

ACADEMIC CURRICULUM

Acalanes High School offers a strong college preparatory program. The school year consists of two 18-week semesters. Students can take up to 7 classes with the majority of upperclassmen enrolled in 6 periods per school day. Classes meet for 230 minutes per week in a modified block schedule. In addition to academically rigorous core courses, we offer a variety arts, science, and technical skills electives.

Academic Policies

Transcript Notations: (p) in course code indicates College Prep courses; (*) in course code indicates non-academic class, not included in Academic GPA, (r) indicates a repeated course.

Transcripts include weighted and non-weighted GPA. Advanced Placement courses (AP) and Honors (H) courses are both weighted in weighted GPA.

Our district policy does not allow students to take graduation requirement coursework through dual enrollment programs. Students may take courses from community college or other institutions for enrichment, but those courses are **not included** on the Acalanes transcript for credit or GPA purposes. Students are advised to disclose all institutions attended and provide official transcripts from each institution.

AP classes: Students are required to take Living Earth and Chemistry of the Earth before taking AP Biology, AP Chemistry, AP Environmental Science or AP Physics 1. AP classes are generally not available to 9th grade students. There is no limit to the number of AP classes a student may take at one time, but sometimes there are schedule conflicts where students aren't able to take all the classes they requested. We encourage them to mention those situations in their application where appropriate.
