#### **AUHSD Data**

- Average Unweighted GPA 3.2
- Average SAT Score 1257
  - National Average 1020
- Average ACT Score 25
  - National Average 21

# Early Action

Non-Binding

Advantages: Earlier

notification, more favorable review at some,

but not all, colleges

Check Merit scholarship deadlines

# Early Decision

Binding <

Appropriate if 100% certain about where you want to attend

Advantages: Earlier notification, more favorable review

# Regular Decision

Non-Binding

Advantages:
Opportunity to
improve grades
during Fall
semester

## Rolling Decision

Non-Binding

Advantages: applications are reviewed in the order they are received





- is a good fit for YOU
- is in the location and has the campus setting you want
- offers the academics you are interested in
- offers the clubs, activities, and student life you are looking for
- is **affordable** for you and your family
- challenges and supports you personally and academically
- is a place you will graduate from

# Refining a "Good" College List

#### **Consider:**

- Would you attend each school on the list?
- Number of different applications
- Number of essays and supplements
- Testing what tests are needed? Test optional?
- Timing of applications can you get them all done if you're busy with water polo season?
- Can you get the applications done and... still pass classes?
   ...be a senior? ...get some sleep?



### **Important Terms**

# Likely

Colleges whose requirements mean little chance of rejection for that applicant.

Don't forget financial fit.

#### Match

The student should fit the general admission criteria in academic and extracurricular categories.

#### Reach

Colleges that are less likely to accept the student. This may be because the student's qualifications match or fall slightly short of the college's average, and the competition is intense.



# The Goal:

#### By October of your Senior Year, your list should be finalized. It should:

- Consist of 6-10 schools
- Include 1-3 "likely" schools (that you would actually go to)
- Be realistic. No more than ⅓ should be "reach"
- Respect parents' input, but not be your parents' list
- You should know why each school is on your list
- You should want to go to each school on your list. What if you only got into one?

# **Application Components**

#### **UGs**

- Self reported grades (no transcripts)
- Official test scores
- Activities and Awards list
- Personal Insight Questions (respond to 4 out of 8 questions - 350 word max for each)

#### **CSUs**

- Self reported grades (no transcripts)
- Official test scores

NO letters of recommendation required

#### **Common Application**

- Transcript
- Official test scores
- Activities and Awards
- Essay (choose 1 from 7 options 650 word max)
- Supplemental Essay (s) depends on the school
- School Report (may include counselor recommendation)
- Teacher letter(s) of recommendation

#### **Coalition Application**

University of Washington and a few others are using only this application

## **Types of Application Review**

#### **Index Review**

- GPA & courses
- Test scores
- Optional essay or short response











#### **Holistic Review**


- Academics
  - Grades, coursework, rigor
  - Standardized tests SAT or ACT
- Achievement outside the classroom (extracurricular activities, employment, volunteer work, etc.)
  - Commitment and Leadership
- Context of High School achievements
- Personal Qualities essays and letters of recommendation
- Match/Fit and demonstrated interest



#### SENDING YOUR SCORES

We get it—things change. While we still automatically send your scores from the ACT®test to the places you requested when you registered, something may have changed since then. Maybe you've got your eye on a new college, have a chance at an unexpected scholarship, or accidentally left off the university you toured last semester.

No need to worry.

You can have your ACT scores sent to other colleges and scholarship agencies, even after you test. Requests are processed after your tests have been scored and all scores for your test option—the ACT or the ACT with writing—are ready.

#### ORDERING OPTIONS

- Online request-create or sign in to your ACT Web account. You must pay by valid credit card.
- Download a PDF copy of the request form.

# Letters of Recommendation

#### **Letters of Recommendation**

- Look at your list of schools and their application requirements to determine if you need letters before asking teachers.
- Goal of the letter:
  - Speak to your personality, character, abilities
  - Fill in the gaps, provide insight
  - Support and augment larger application narrative
- Who should you ask?
  - Someone who knows you well! More important than someone who teaches a subject related to your potential major.
  - Ideally someone in the past two years
  - Not necessarily someone who gave you a good grade

\*May be exceptions to this if applying to programs like arts or engineering.

#### **Letters of Recommendation: Process**

#### Fall of Senior Year:

- Request recommendations in person.
- Request recommender through Naviance.
- Provide your recommenders with background information so that they can write thorough and personalized letters.
- Write thank you notes!



### **School Report forms and Counselor Letter**

Common App requires a School Report with a transcript

Counselors have the **option** of submitting a letter of recommendation with a School Report

#### To get a counselor recommendation:


- 1. Ask your counselor in person
- 2. Know your earliest deadline that requires a school report
- Complete the Student Statement Survey in Naviance. Have a parent complete the Parent Statement survey
- 4. Complete the resume in Naviance

Your counselor cannot complete a School Report or send a letter until:


- 1. Your list of colleges is up to date
- 2. Your Common App and Naviance accounts are matched
- 3. Your transcripts are paid for




