Acalanes Union High School District Measure E Citizens' Oversight Committee 2017 - 2018 Fiscal Year Annual Report December 12, 2018

On November 4, 2008, 64% of the voters in the Acalanes Union High School District supported Measure E:

"to establish a ten year technology fund, upgrade instructional classroom technology, replace worn, aging roofs, convert obsolete facilities into additional classroom space, upgrade electrical and energy management systems to improve efficiency, and repair, construct, equip or upgrade school facilities. Under the law, the revenue from Measure E can only be spent on building and renovating facilities and technology updating."

In accordance with Proposition 39, the Strict Accountability in Local Construction Bonds Act of 2000, the Acalanes Union High School District Governing Board established an independent Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee to monitor the expenditure of Measure E bond proceeds, and to keep the public informed. Six members of the public serve on the Oversight Committee. Committee members are John DiBene, Elizabeth Bettis, Sandra Breber, Philip Newsom, Michael Robertson and Lisa Sun.

Measure E bond funds were specifically designed to renovate or replace existing facilities at the four comprehensive high schools, Acalanes, Campolindo, Las Lomas, Miramonte, and the Del Valle Education Center, (which includes Acalanes Center for Independent Study, the Transition and Adult Education programs) and the District Office.

In November 2014, the District issued \$15 million of bond anticipated notes (BANs) to complete the remaining unfunded projects. Listed below is a summary of FY 17-18 expenditures.

Attachment A summarizes the status of each active Measure E project as of June 30, 2018. The Committee reviewed information provided by the District regarding the projects completed during the fiscal year ended June 30, 2018, and visited several construction sites. Christy White & Associates, independent auditor, presented to the Committee on October 18, 2018 the performance and financial audit for the period

ending June 30, 2018. The Committee noted that the external auditors did not identify any deficiencies in internal controls that they would consider to be material weaknesses or instances of noncompliance related to the financial statements. Based on this scope, the Committee concluded that the 2017-18 projects listed above were completed in compliance with the intent of Measure E.
