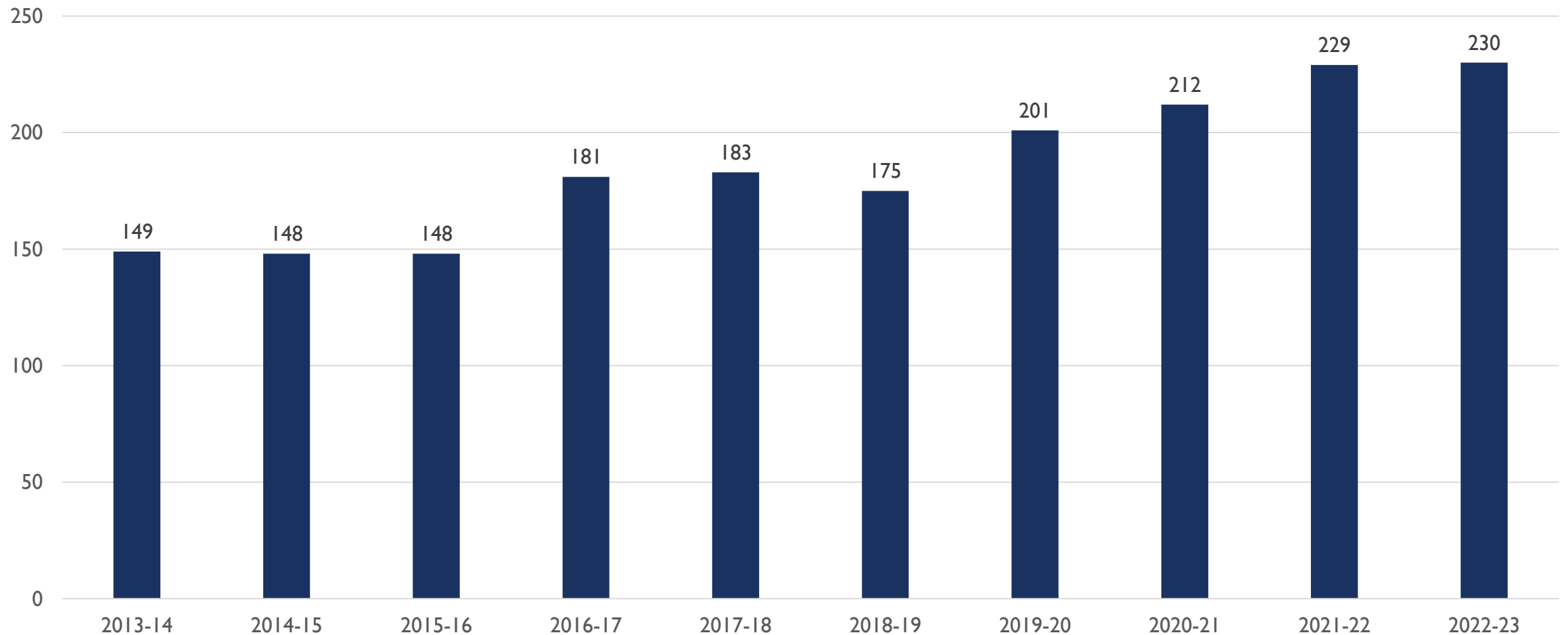

- Greater number of multiple choice questions

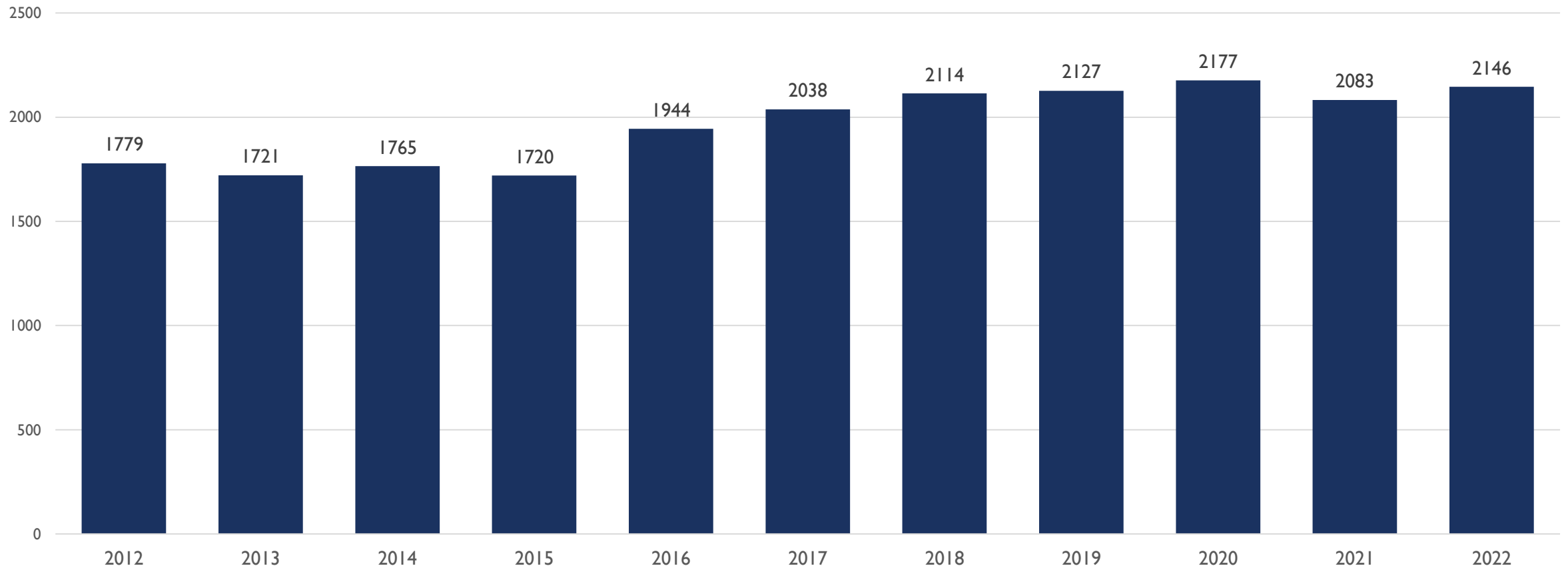

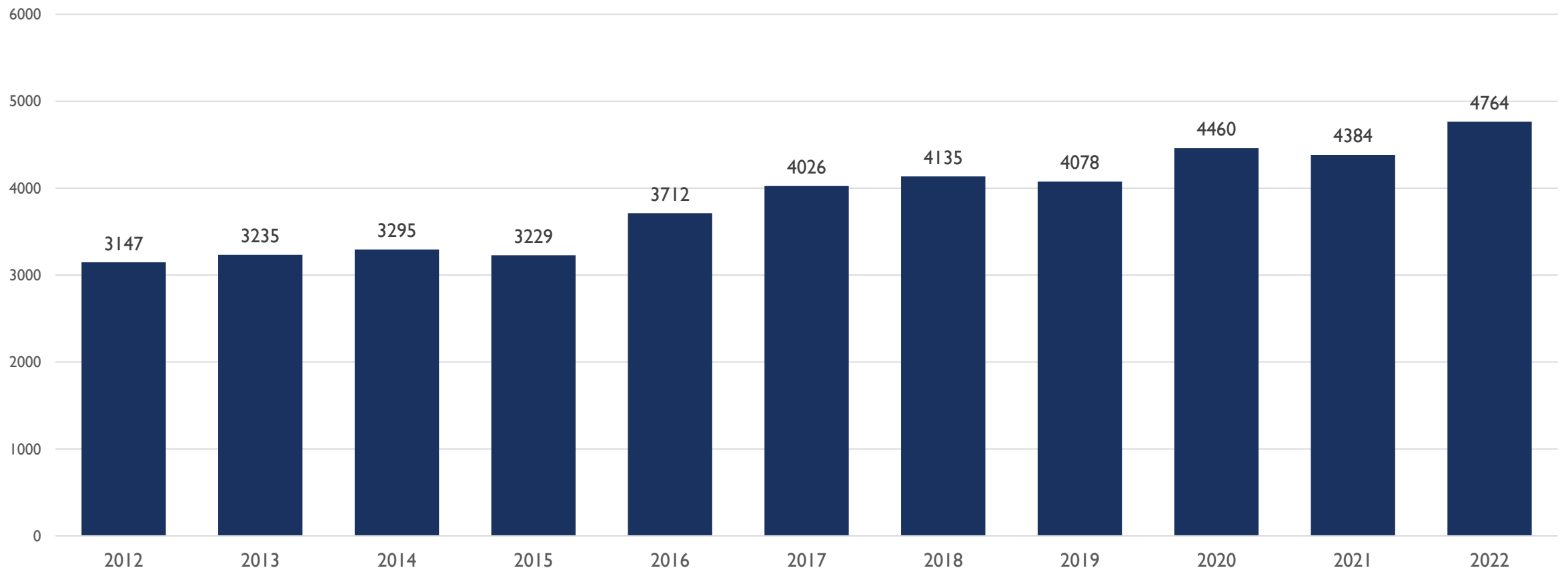
Number of AUHSD Students Taking AP Exams

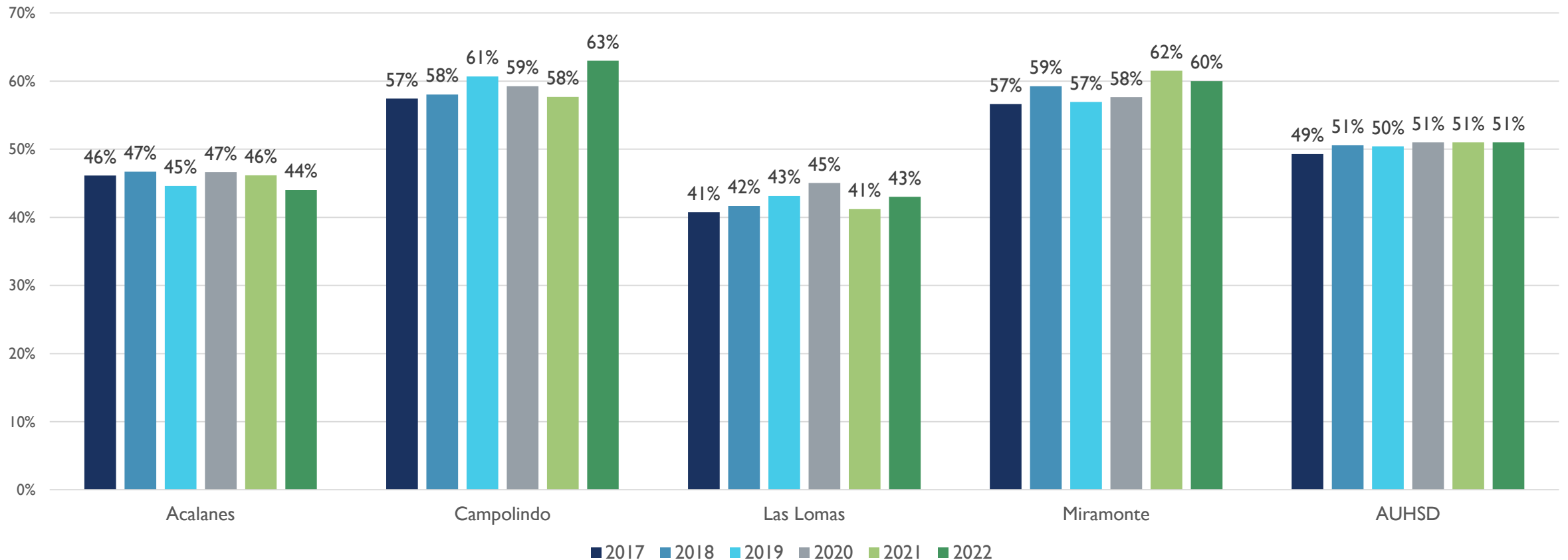
Number of AP Exams Taken in AUHSD

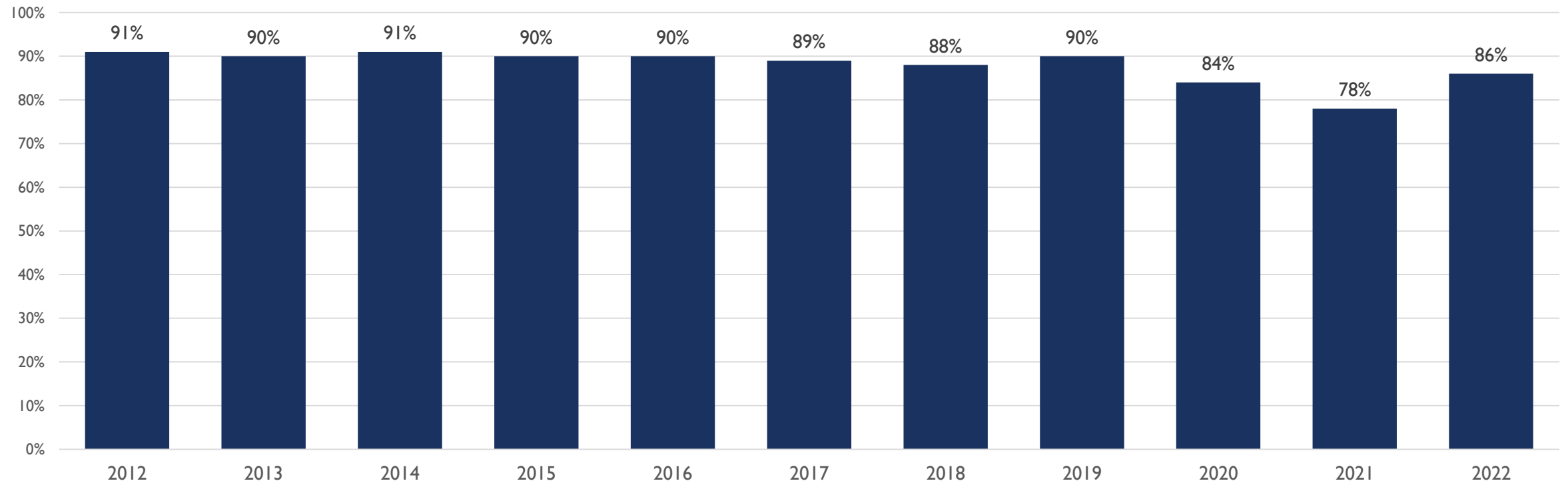
Percentage of AUHSD Students, Grades 10-12 ,Taking One or More AP Exams

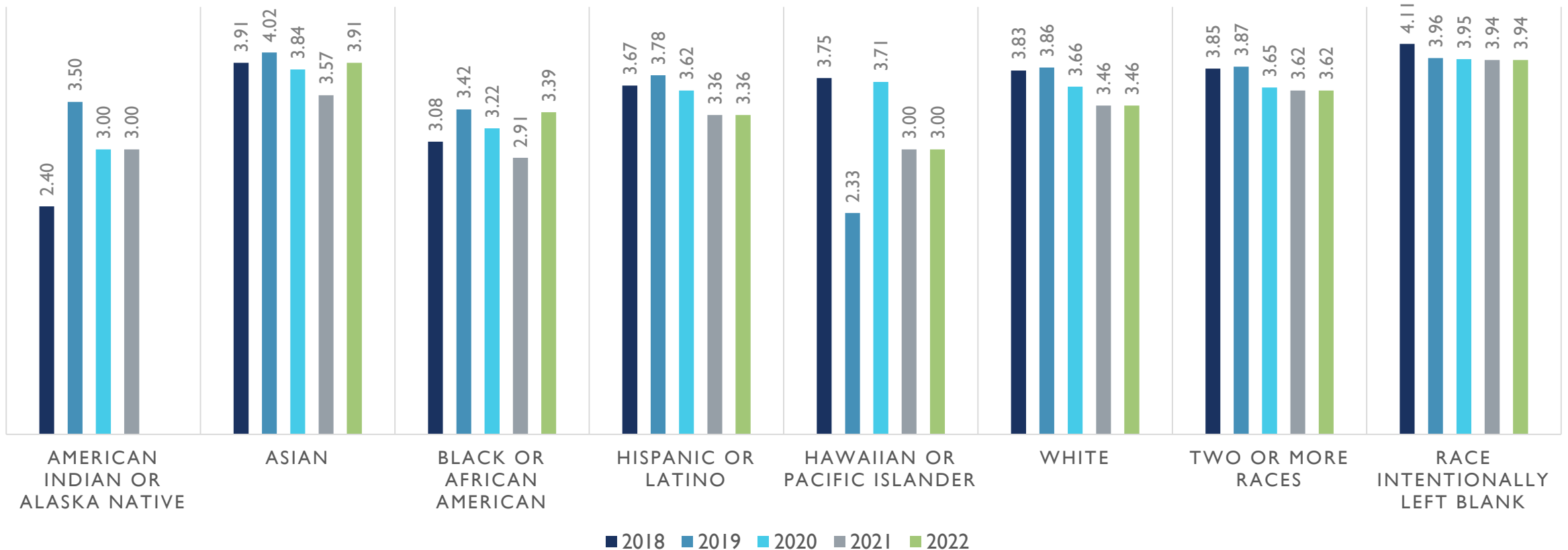

Observations

- Number of AUHSD AP course offerings is extensive
- Number of AUHSD AP course sections continues to increase
- Number of AUHSD students taking AP exams continues to increase, with the recent exception of 2021
- Number of AP exams taken continues to increase across the District
- AUHSD AP passing rate increased from 2021 to 2022

SAT Program

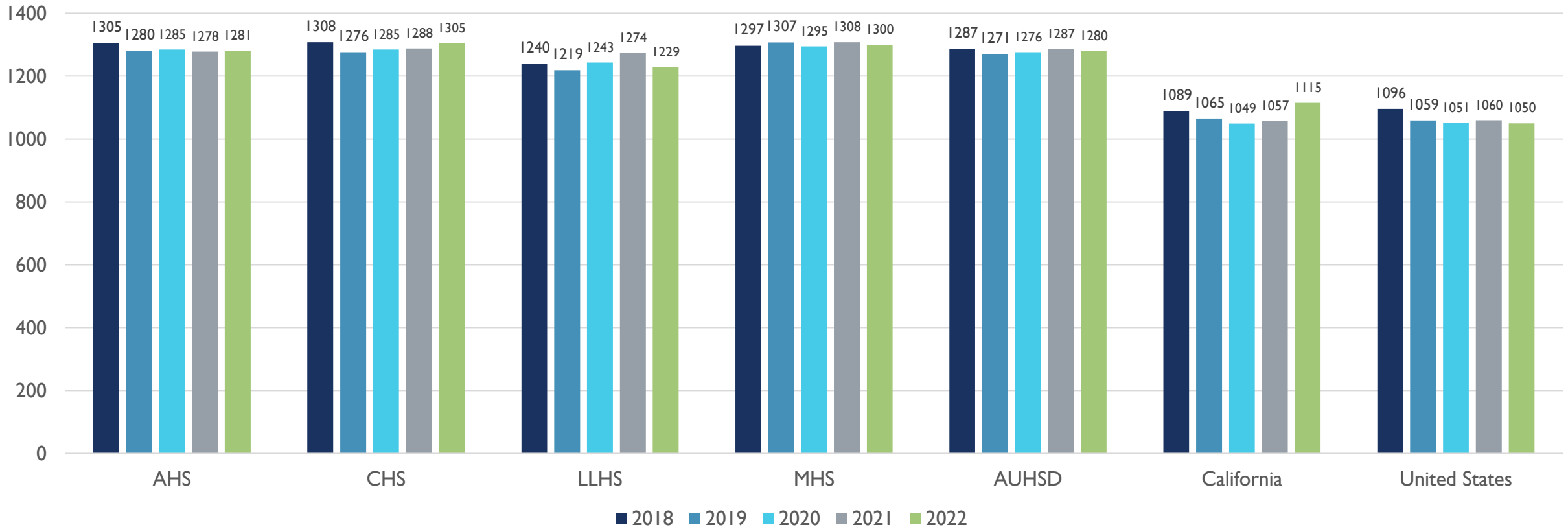
- SAT uses an overall 1600 point scale. Test was redesigned in 2016 (overall score of 2400 point scale changed to 1600 point scale)
- UC and CSU did not utilize SAT scores for 2021 and 2022 admissions
- 1,800+ colleges and universities are now test-optional for admissions, including 130+ colleges and universities in California*

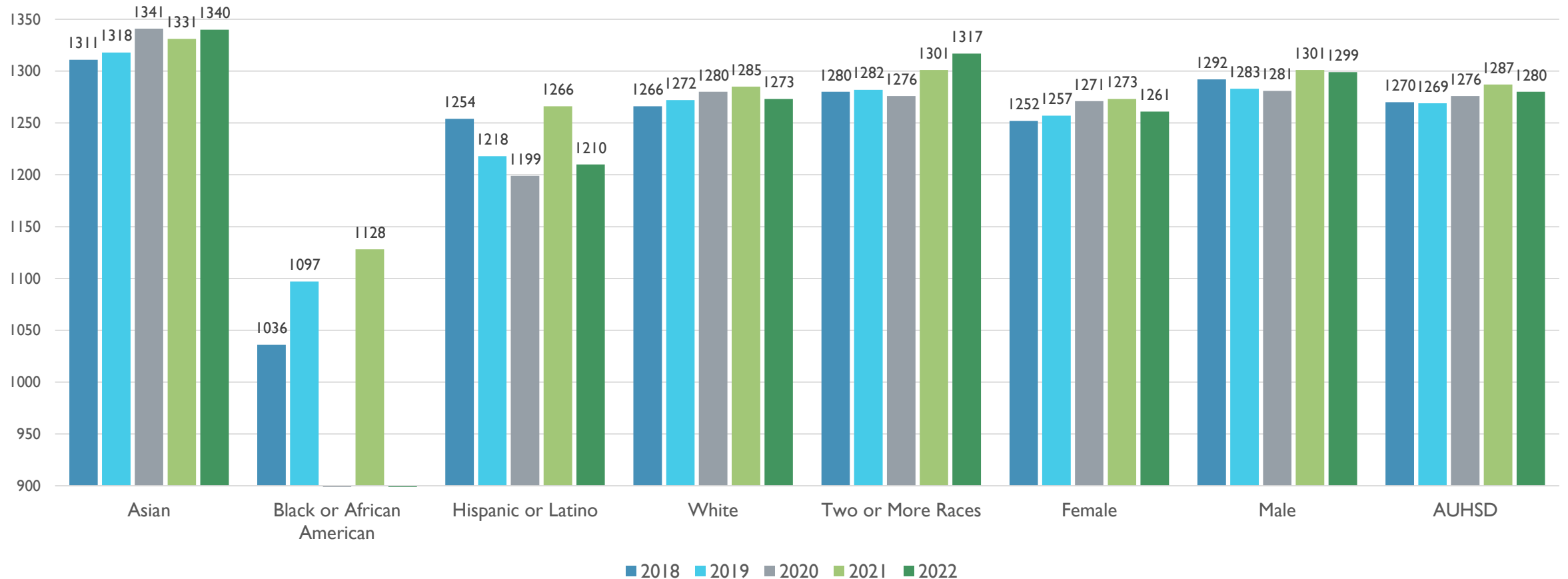
SAT Total Mean Score

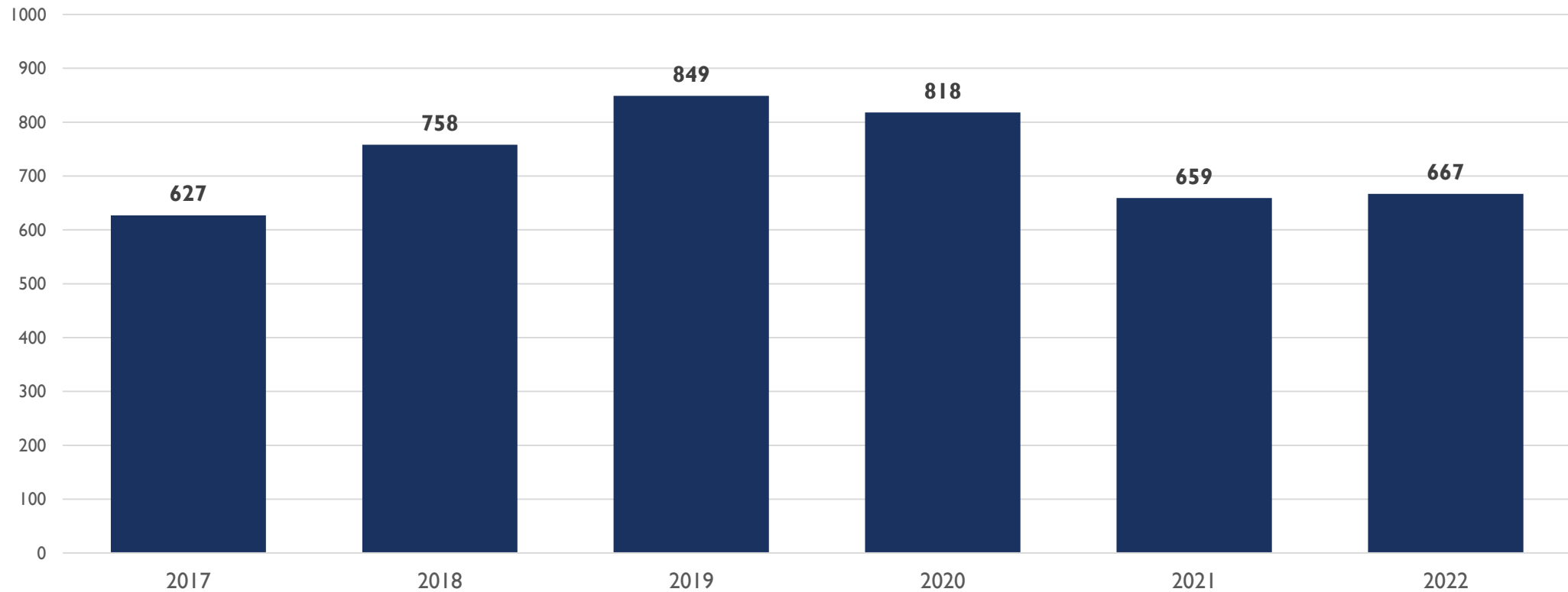

ACT Program

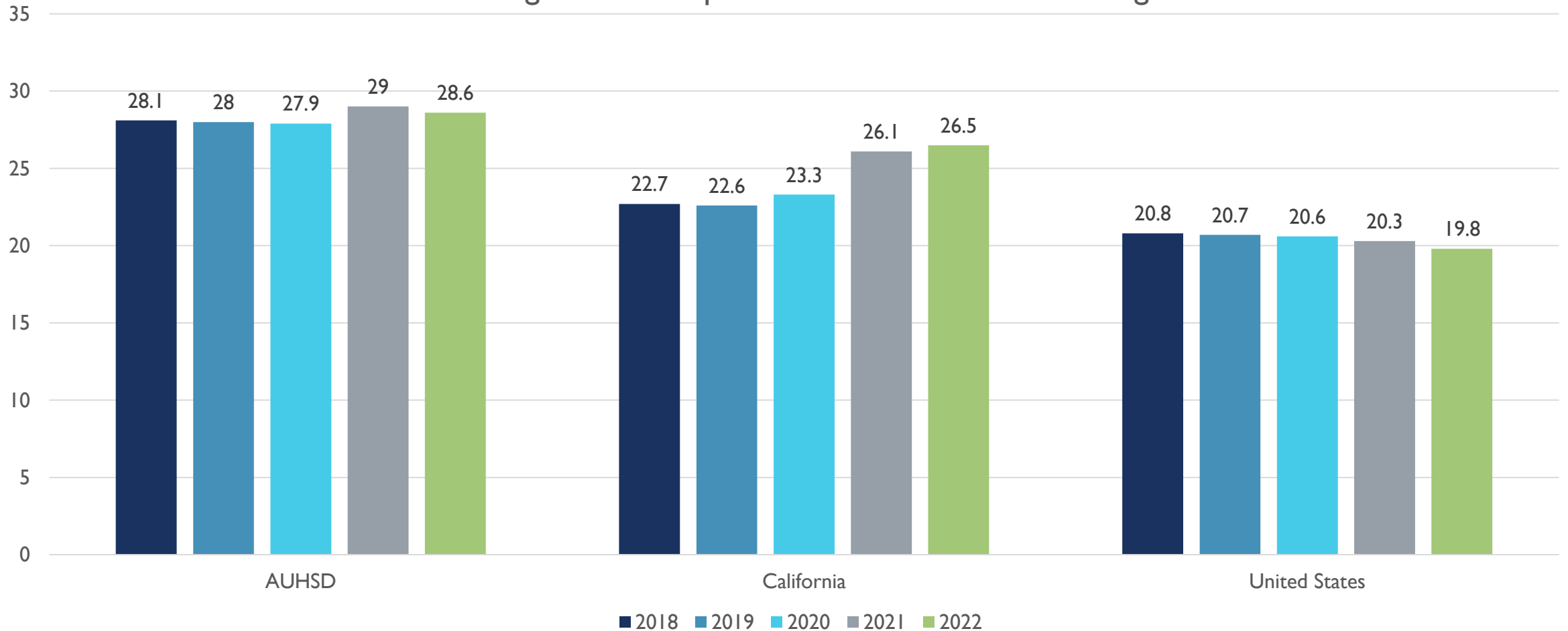
- No major changes in the assessment (Overall scale: 0 to 36 points)
- Continuous adjustment to align the assessment to the standards and curriculum
- Assessment consists of four multiple-choice tests: English, Math, Reading, and Science
- Writing component optional
- UC and CSU did not utilize ACT scores for 2021 and 2022 admissions
- 1,800+ colleges and universities are now test-optional for admissions, including 130+ colleges and universities in California*

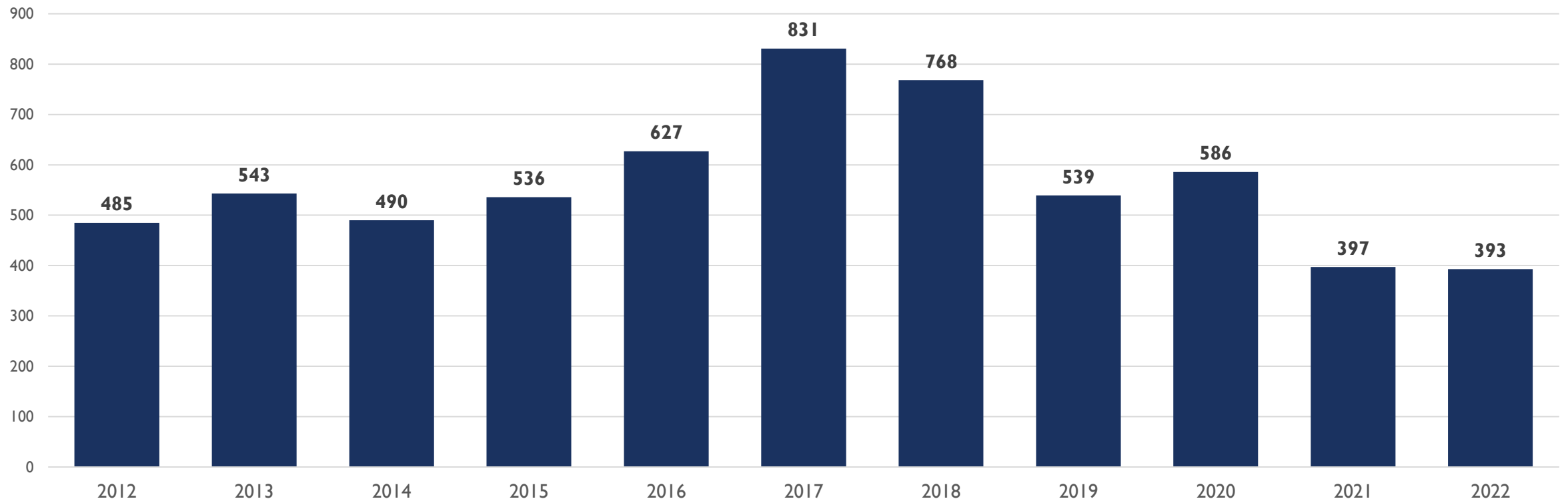
Average ACT Composite Score: Five Years of Testing

STANDARDIZED TESTS FOR COLLEGE ADMISSIONS – SAT & ACT



Observations

- SAT
 - Participation down
 - 2 sites saw an increase in scores and 2 sites saw a decrease in scores from 2021 to 2022
 - Significant gains in scores for students who identify with Two or More Races
 - Significant decrease in scores for students who identify as Hispanic/Latino
 - AUHSD scores remain significantly higher than state and national averages
- ACT
 - Participation down
 - No significant change in scores over past 5 years
 - AUHSD scores remain higher than state and national averages

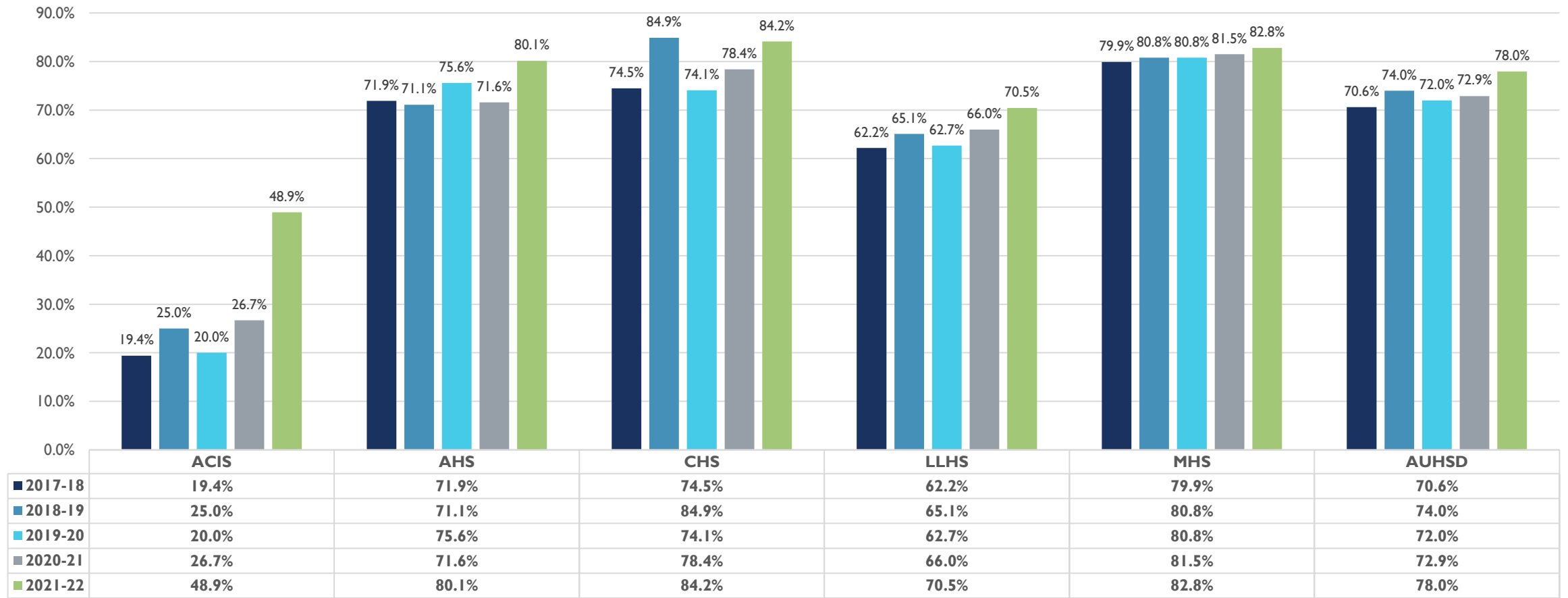

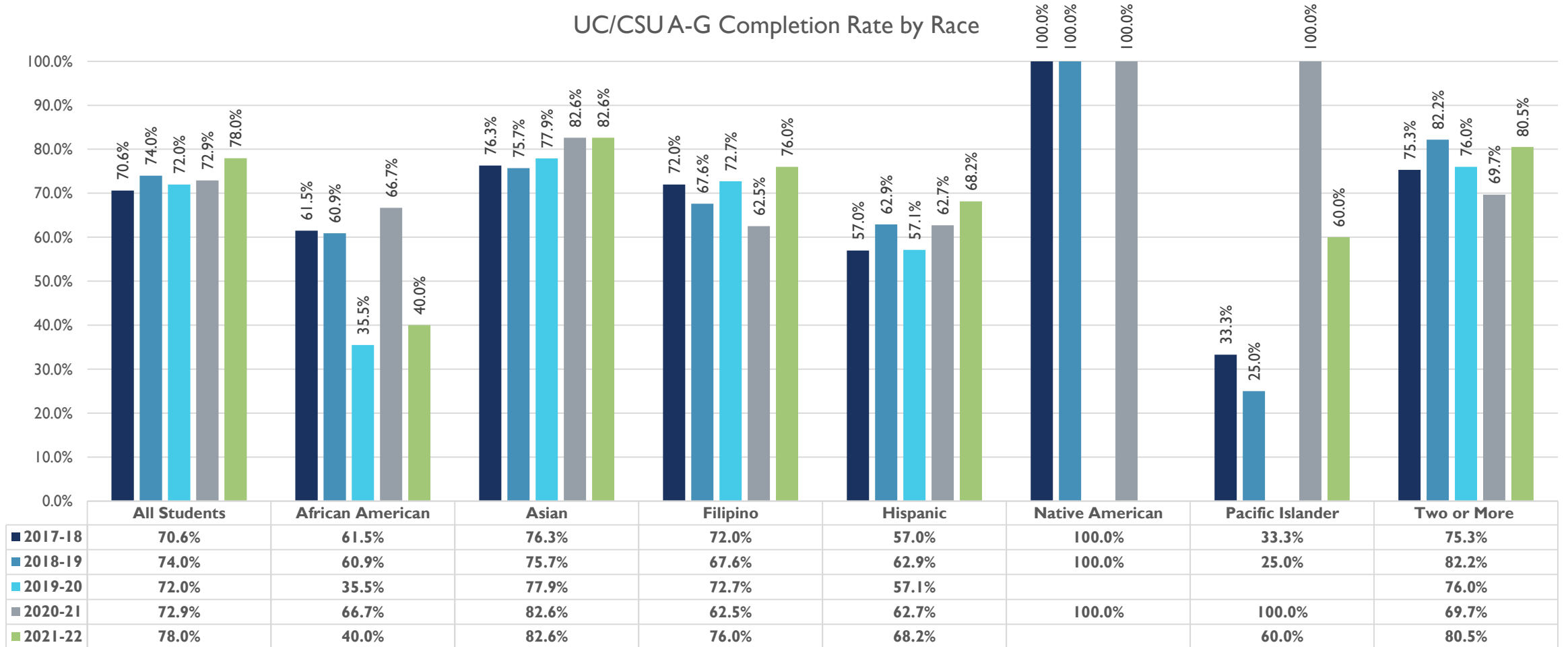
UC/CSU A-G Completion Rate by School

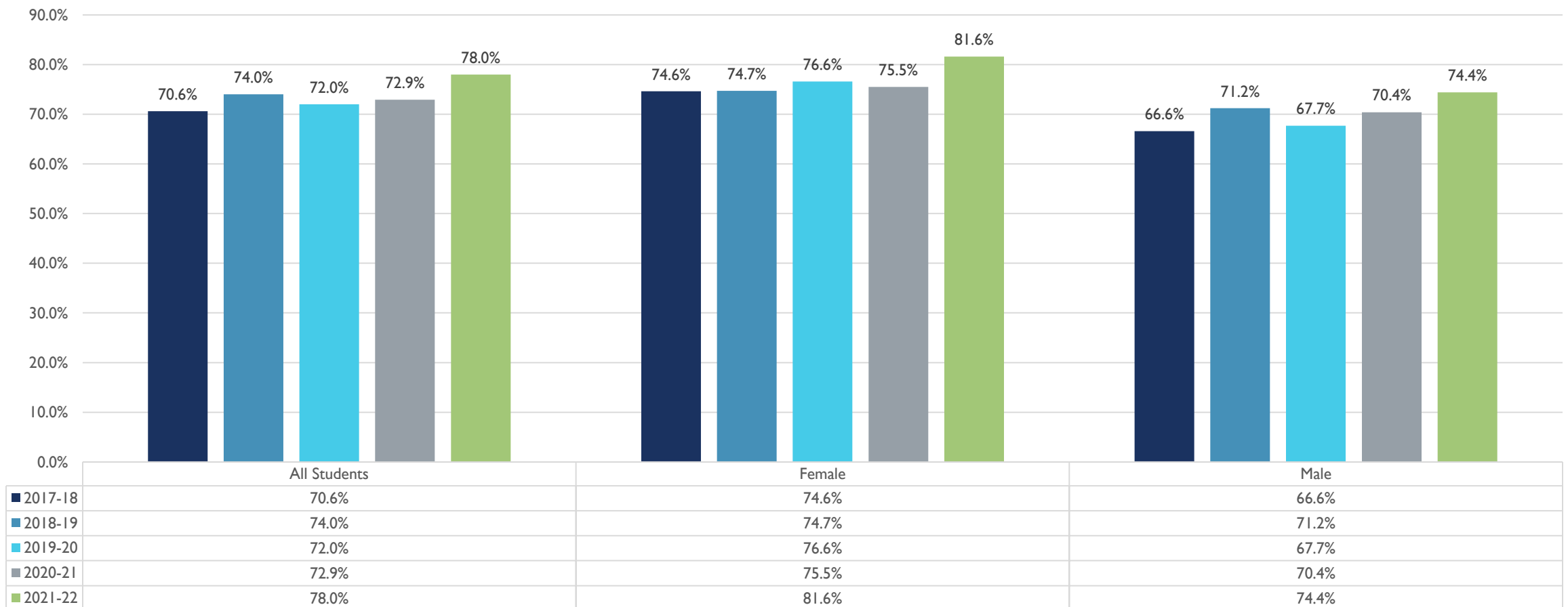
UC/CSU A-G Completion Rate by Race

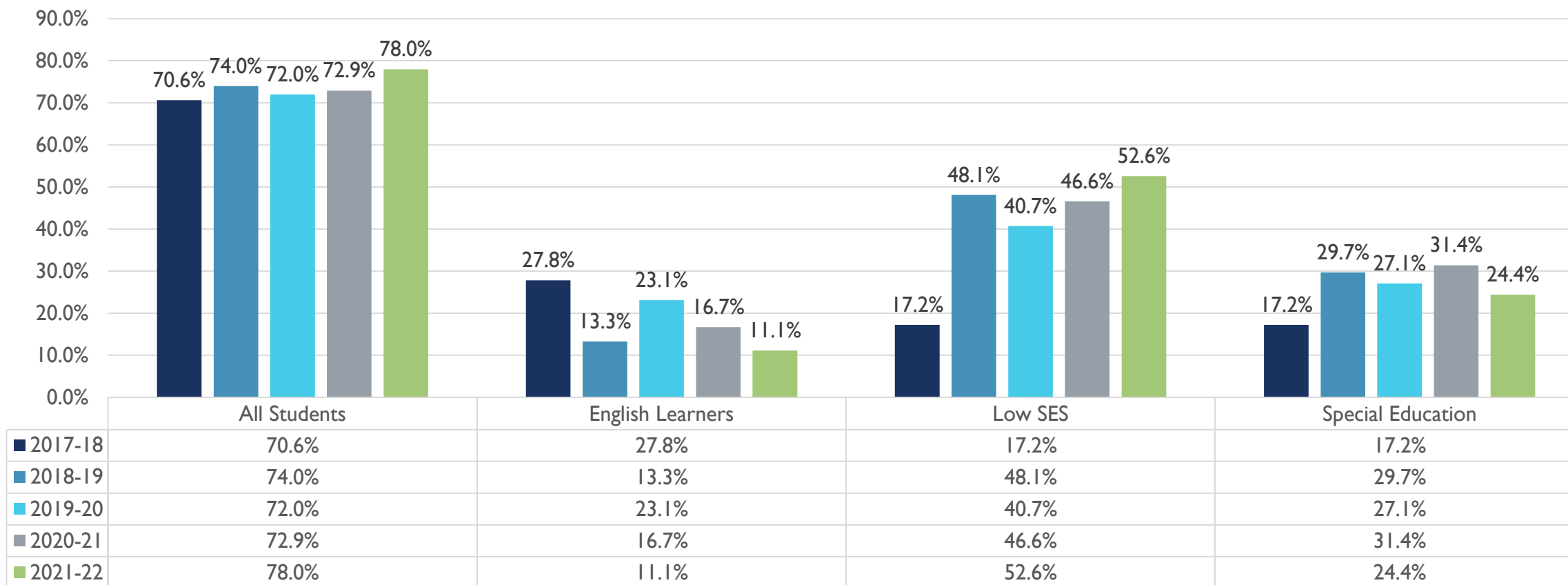
UC/CSU A-G Completion Rate by Gender

Observations

- AUHSD UC/CSU A-G completion rate increased from 2021 to 2022
- 2022 UC/CSU A-G completion rate for AUHSD – highest in District history
- All sites saw an increase in overall UC/CSU A-G completion rate from 2021 to 2022
- 4 out of 5 schools had their highest UC/CSU A-G completion rate ever in 2022
- Students identifying as African American and Hispanic/Latino have lower UC/CSU A-G completion rates than peers
- English Learners and Special Education students have lower UC/CSU A-G completion rates than peers
