## Graduation Data

**Graduation Rates:** The 2024 Assessment Report presents data related to the four-year adjusted cohort graduation rate (ACGR). The four-year ACGR is the number of students who graduate from high school in four years with a regular high school diploma divided by the number of students who form the four-year adjusted cohort for the graduating class. The four-year adjusted cohort is based on the number of students who enter grade 9 for the first time with the following adjustments: (1) Adding into the cohort any student who transfers in later during grade 9 or during the next three years and (2) Subtracting any student from the cohort who transfers out, emigrates to another country, transfers to a prison or juvenile facility, or dies during that same period. The ACGR includes students earning a “regular high school diploma” and does not include students earning a general-equivalency diploma, certificate of completion, certificate of attendance, or any other similar or lesser credential, such as a diploma based on meeting Individualized Education Program (IEP) goals. In addition to addressing the overall ACGR, this report includes AUHSD graduation data disaggregated by race/ethnicity, gender, and student program.

**Graduation Distinctions:** This report also presents data on graduates who met the UC/CSU A-G course requirements, earned a State Seal of Biliteracy, or earned a Golden Seal Merit Diploma. Details about these graduation distinctions follow:

- **Meeting the UC/CSU A-G Requirements:** The four-year adjusted cohort graduates who AUHSD determined met all the A-G course requirements for admission to the University of California or California State University system.
- **Earning the State Seal of Biliteracy:** The four-year adjusted cohort graduates who, in accordance with Education Code Section 51460(a), attain a high level of proficiency in one or more languages (including American Sign Language) in addition to English.
- **Earning a Golden State Seal Merit Diploma:** The four-year adjusted cohort graduates who, in accordance with Education Code Section 51454, earn the Golden State Seal Merit Diploma by having (1) Completed all requirements for a high school diploma, and (2) Demonstrated mastery of the curriculum in at least six subject areas. Four of the subject areas are mathematics, English language arts, science, and United States history, with the remaining two subject areas selected by the student.

## **Standardized Tests for College Admissions**

## The SAT

The SAT is a College Board assessment designed to assess student reasoning based on knowledge and skills. The SAT has two sections: (1) Reading and Writing and (2) Math. (In some states, students may take an optional essay component.) Scores for each of the two main sections range from 200-800. A student’s total SAT score is the sum of the section scores and will range from 400-1600. The SAT sets benchmark scores to indicate college readiness. SAT test takers who meet the Evidence-Based Reading and Writing (ERW) or Math benchmarks have a 75% chance of earning a course grade of C or higher in related first-semester, credit-bearing college courses.

The charts below present AUHSD SAT scores over a five-year period: 2020-2024. If a student took the SAT more than once, the most recent score is included.

### The ACT

The ACT is a standards-based test designed to assess student readiness for college. The assessment consists of four multiple-choice tests: English, mathematics, reading, and science (Score range of 1-36). The ACT has an optional component that measures writing skills. A student’s ACT Composite score is the average of their four test scores, rounded to the nearest whole number. The ACT is reviewed and revised on a regular basis to adjust to changing standards and curriculum.
