Interim Assessments

- Increase in use of Interim Assessment Blocks in ELA and math in preparation for the summative assessment in all schools
- School sites utilized Interim Assessment Blocks to provide students with the testing interface practice
- Teachers utilized the Interim Assessment Blocks to assess standards and practice alignment

Digital Library

- Continues to have limited use in AUHSD high schools
- The amount of high school resources is increasing, however utility still seems inadequate





Summative Assessments for grade 11 students


- English Language Arts and Literacy
 - Participation: 1308 students, 97% of AUHSD 11th graders
- Mathematics
 - Participation: 1292 students, 96% of AUHSD 11th graders
- Student Scores:
 - Overall score ranging from 2000 to 3000
 - Academic achievement level:
 - Standard exceeded (Level 4)
 - Standard met (Level 3)
 - Standard nearly met (Level 2)
 - Standard not met (Level 1)




Percent of Students Meeting or Exceeding Standards – ELA and Math 2019




Percent of Students Meeting Standards - ELA 2015-2019









2019 Math Claim Performance: Percent of Students at Each Level







2019 SBA Achievement by Subgroup Percent of Students Meeting or Exceeding Standards




ELA SBA Three Year (2017-2019) Score Comparison by Subgroup Percent of students meeting or exceeding standards



















Math SBA Three Year (2017-2019) Score Comparison by Subgroup Percent of Students Meeting or Exceeding Standards













2015 - 2019- AUHSD Achievement Gap SBA Math

Smarter Balanced Assessment Overview

Smarter Balanced Assessment Observations and Next Steps:

- AUHSD Smarter Balanced Assessment data shows improvement in achievement.
- Noted continued achievement gap in performance between groups of students.
- AUSHD staff is focusing on supporting students through targeted intervention and classroom strategies.
- Staff is reviewing alignment to the California State Standards (Common Core) in core subjects and continues to work on implementation on the standards and the aligned courses of study.



California Alternate Assessment

California Alternate Assessment (CAA)

- Assessment aligned to Core Content Connectors (alternate achievement standards)
- Grade 11 students with significant cognitive disabilities
- 2016-2017 CAA individual scores were sent to students (school and district data not available)
- 2017-2018 CAA scores: individual and district level scores available
- 2018-2019 CAA scores: individual scores sent to students, districtwide scores not published due to too few students

Reporting Performance Level Descriptors:

- Level 3 Alternate (student showed understanding of...)
- Level 2 Alternate (student showed **foundational understanding** of...)
- Level 1 Alternate (student showed limited understanding of...)



California Science Test (CAST)

California Science Test (CAST)

2017-2018 CAST

- Field Test (participation data used for federal accountability, student performance data not reported)
- All grade 12 students in the state took CAST
- Assessment was based on the NGSS 5 domains (Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Earth and Space, Engineering)

2018-2019 CAST (Operational)

- Test administered to students in their last year of science (student choice)
- Student may take CAST only once in their high school career
- Districts will receive individual science scores in January 2020, however will not receive districtwide scores, nor will the score be published.


AUHSD Focus on Achievement Grades

- Focus on students receiving one or more D or F grades
- LCAP goal
- Intervention strategies: RTI, Academy strategies
- Instructional practices
- Specific focus is placed on student subgroups and the persisting achievement gap
- Significantly higher numbers of English Learners, students with disabilities and students who are socioeconomically disadvantaged receive D and F grades




Achievement Grades – End of Year (2018-2019)

Achievement Grades End of Year 2018-2019 by Student Subgroup


Percent of AUHSD Students Receiving One or More Grades Below a "C" 2018-2019 by Student Subgroup





- All courses completed with a grade C or above




Percent of Graduates A-G Ready, 2017-2019




Graduation Data: A-G Readiness by Subgroup






Graduation Data: A-G Readiness by Subgroup (Gender)






Graduation Data: AG Readiness by Subgroup (Race and Ethnicity)

- Scores based Healthy Fitness Zone standards


All teachers in the district calibrated test administration practices



Acalanes Union High Percent of Students Passing Fitness Tasks-Overall 2017-2019


