




Average Hours of Weekday Homework



Hours of Weekday Homework by Grade




Average Hours of Weekend Homework




Hours of Weekend Homework by Grade




2015 – Student perception regarding amount of homework.



2017 – Student perception regarding amount of homework.







Average Extracurricular Hours During Week





Average Extracurricular Hours During Weekend





How much pressure do you feel to do well in school? -- 4.2





Survey of School Experiences: Academic Engagement

- "Fully engagement" -- High levels of behavioral, affective, and cognitive engagement in their schoolwork.
- "Purposefully engaged" -- Work hard on their schoolwork and find their schoolwork meaningful.
- "Doing school" -- Often or always work hard, but they rarely, if ever, find their schoolwork interesting, fun, or valuable.
- "Disengaged" -- No engagement in their schoolwork. These students did not work hard, enjoy, or find value in their schoolwork.




