Guidelines for Communication with Private Tutors

- Teachers have a professional obligation to communicate effectively with parents and students.
- When in doubt, teachers should check with a site administrator to ascertain whether an adult who has made contact with the teacher is truly a person vested with student educational rights.
- Teachers should not communicate directly with private tutors without a written release of information agreement from the custodial parent.
- There is no obligation for teachers to communicate directly with private tutors. Even when there is a written release of information form and a teacher is receptive to such a release, it is always best to release information directly to the custodial parent, rather than a third party.
- Students should not receive extraordinary treatment regarding academic obligations solely at the request of a private tutor.
- Extra assignments or supplementary materials should not be supplied to a student due to a request from a private tutor, unless these assignments or materials are or can be made available to all students.
- Teachers should use their professional judgment in determining the optimal educational practices necessary to provide students with appropriate learning support opportunities.
- Always consider what is in the best academic interest of students while being cognizant of confidentiality requirements.
